**What was the fox thinking?** E.g. Any minute now I'll eat him up, what a fine looking Gingerbread Man!

Remember to include **capital letters**, **full stops** and **all sentences must make sense**.

Could you try adding some **POWER WORDS** - **cunning**, **sprinted**, **crafty**, **sneakily**

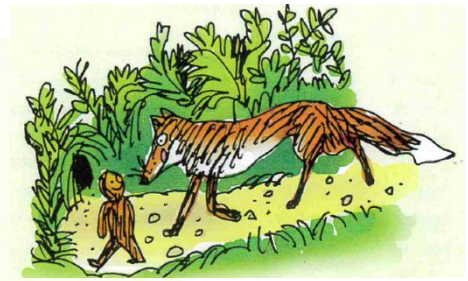
**Please write the date and title please.**
