### **variety**

### 2- Upleveling sentences:

Uplevel this sentence in your English book by adding a **fronted adverbial** and an **expanded noun phrase** (don't forget to add today's date and a title) – don't forget a comma after a fronted adverbial.

*The car screeched to a halt outside the bank.*

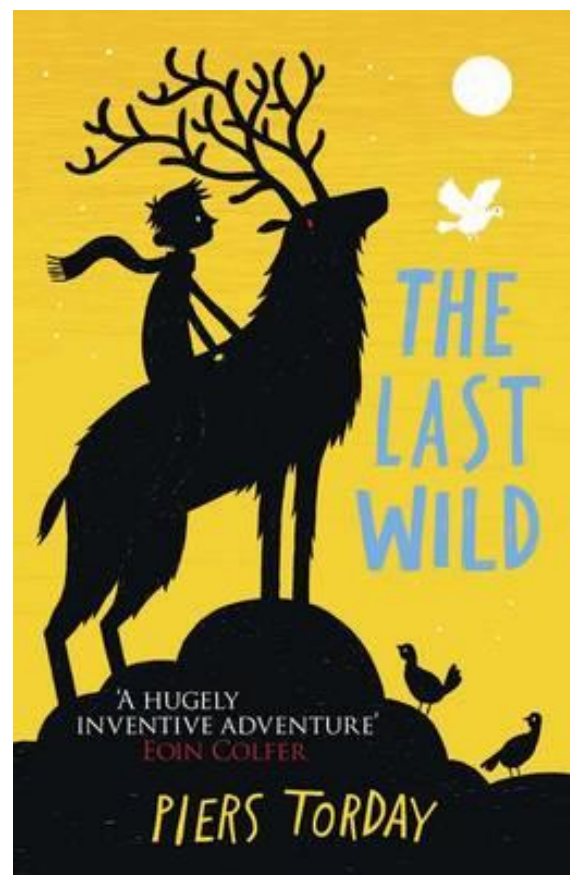
*(Hint- a fronted adverbial is followed by a comma and an expanded noun phrase add detail about the noun and in this sentence would probably tell us about the car e.g if the noun was bus, it may become the local red service bus )*

### 3- The Last Wild by Piers Torday-

We are going to start looking at our class text today. The activities this morning involve you being a narrative detective.

- Look carefully at the **front cover of the book** on **worksheet 1 in the English folder**. Think carefully about what you can see, what it might be about, whether you think you'll enjoy it and what questions it makes you want to know the answers to. Complete the task by answering the questions fully either on the sheet or in your English book. (Don't forget to stick your sheet in if you write on it.)
- Now take a look at the **'predictions' sheet** which shows you the blurb from the back cover. Think about the extra information you now have and think of some other questions that this information now poses for you.  
What do you think the book might be about now? Have you changed your mind or added any detail to your predictions? Complete the question either on the sheet or in your book.

Please write **neatly and carefully**- think about your **handwriting, punctuation and spelling**.
