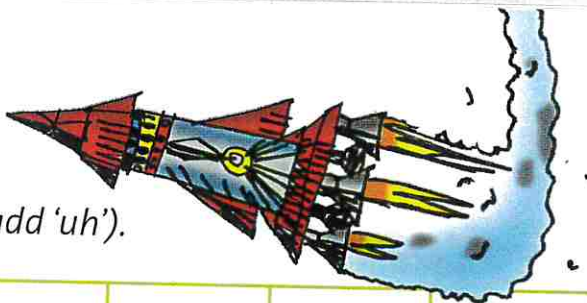

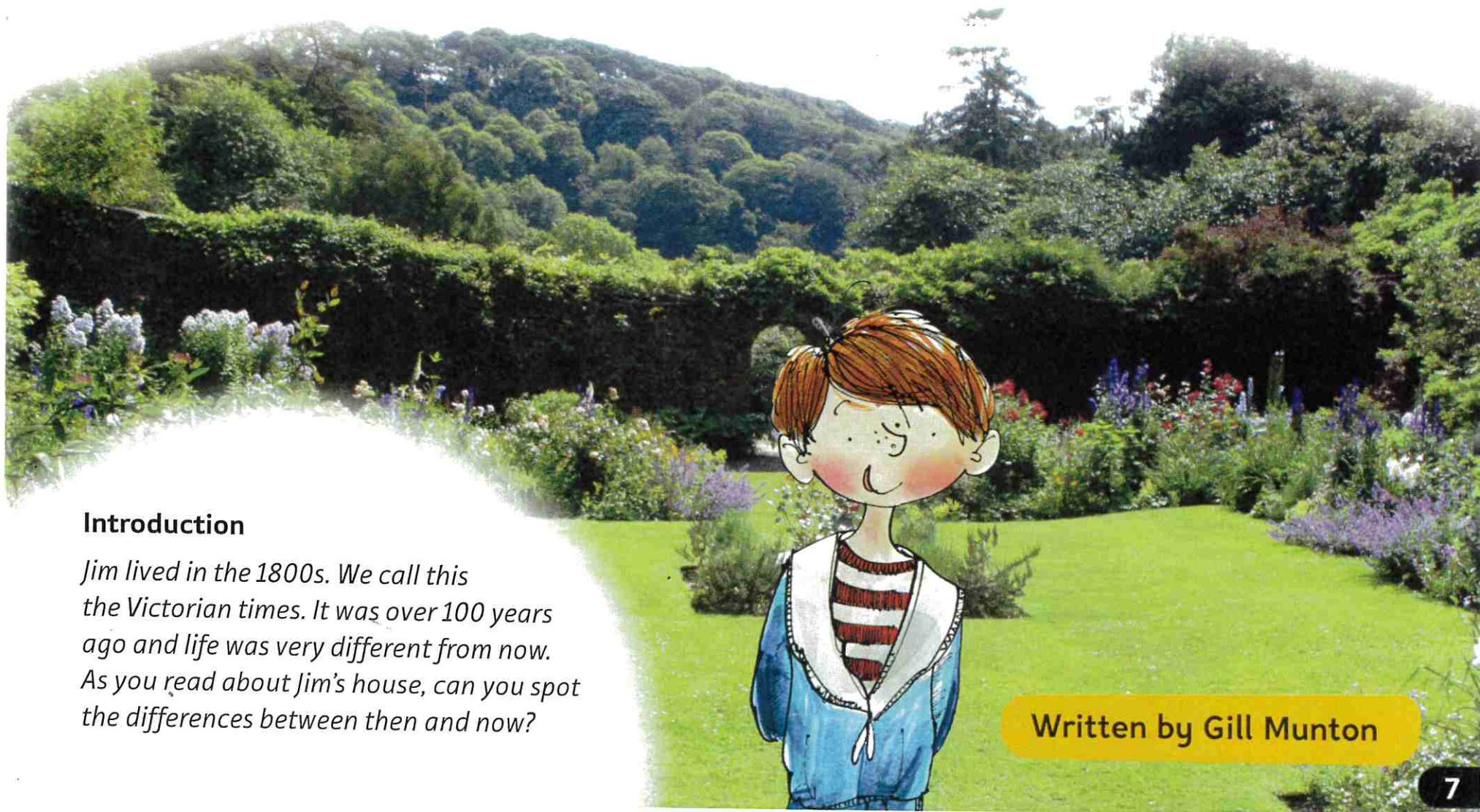

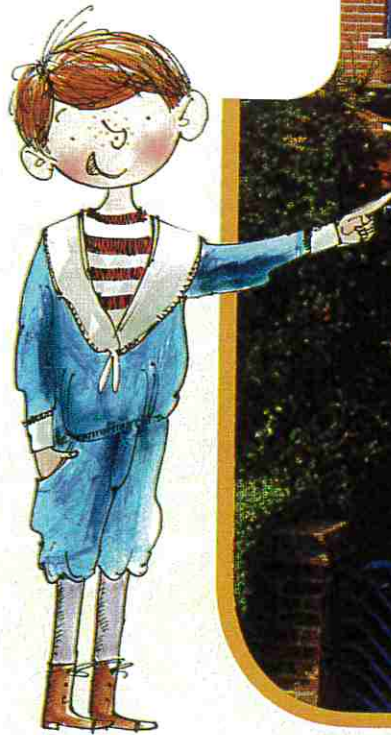

The kitchen

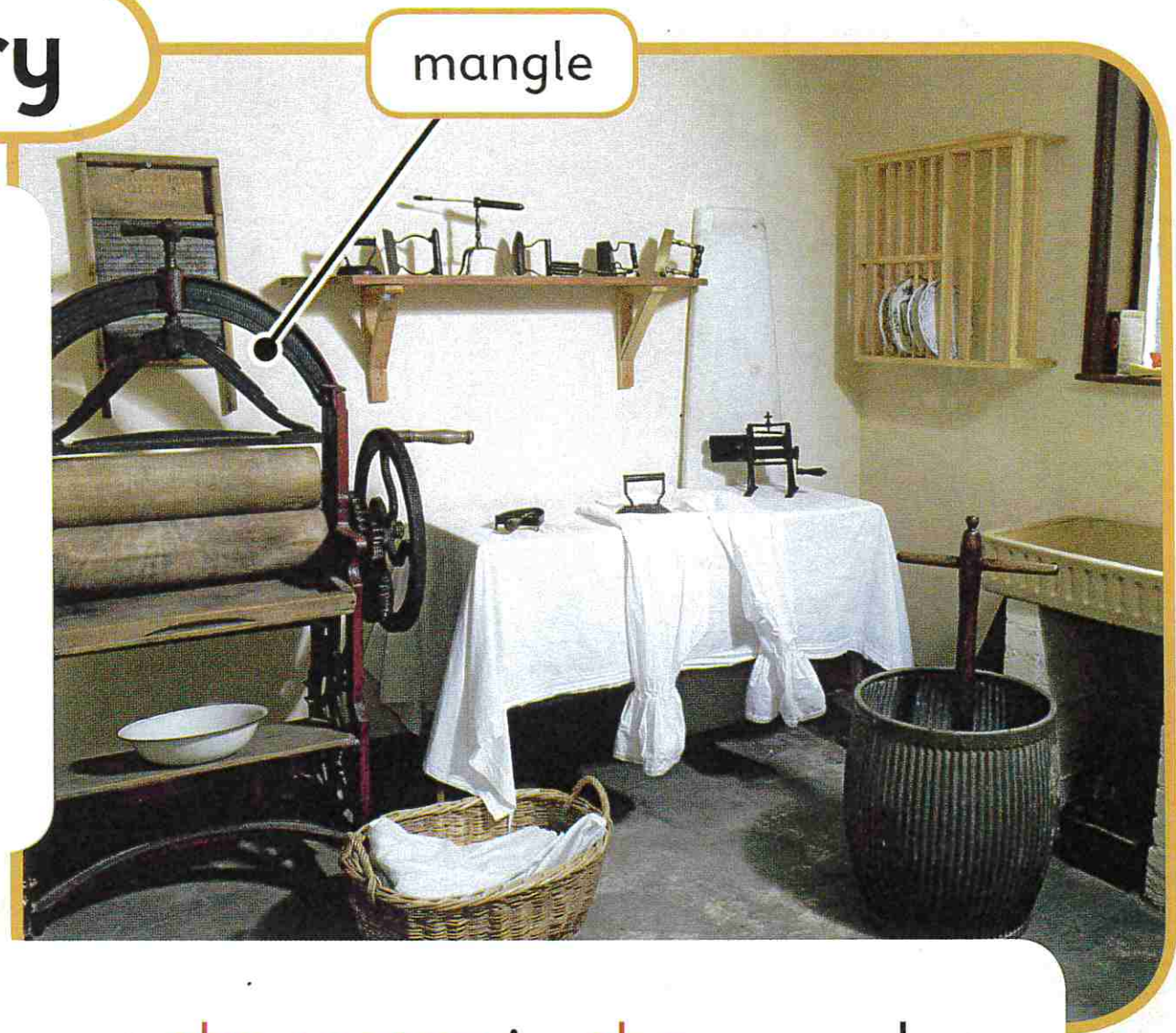
Our cook cooks **our** food in this room.

The sitting room

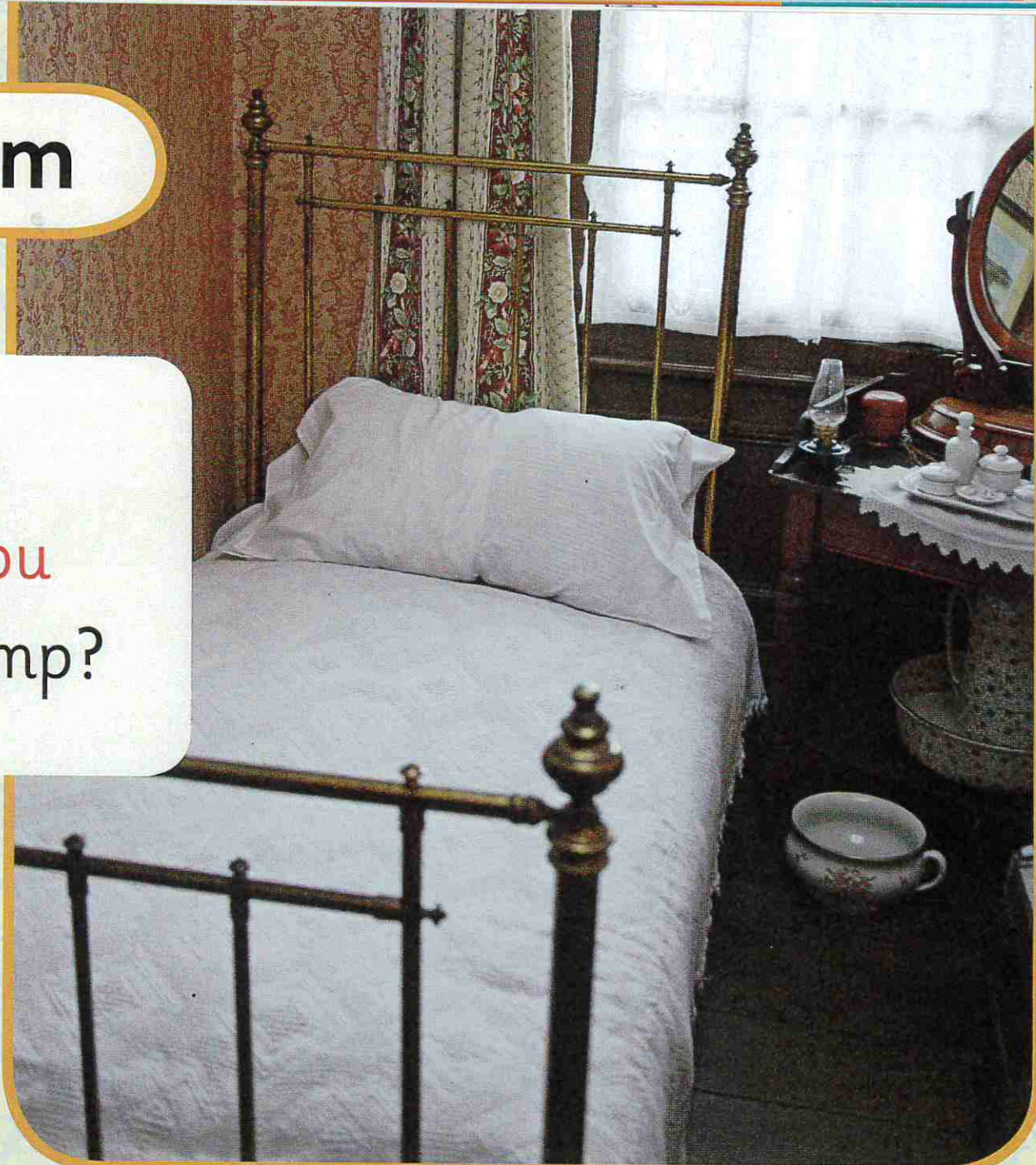
We sit and sing songs in this room.

I sleep in this room. Can **you** see **the oil lamp**?

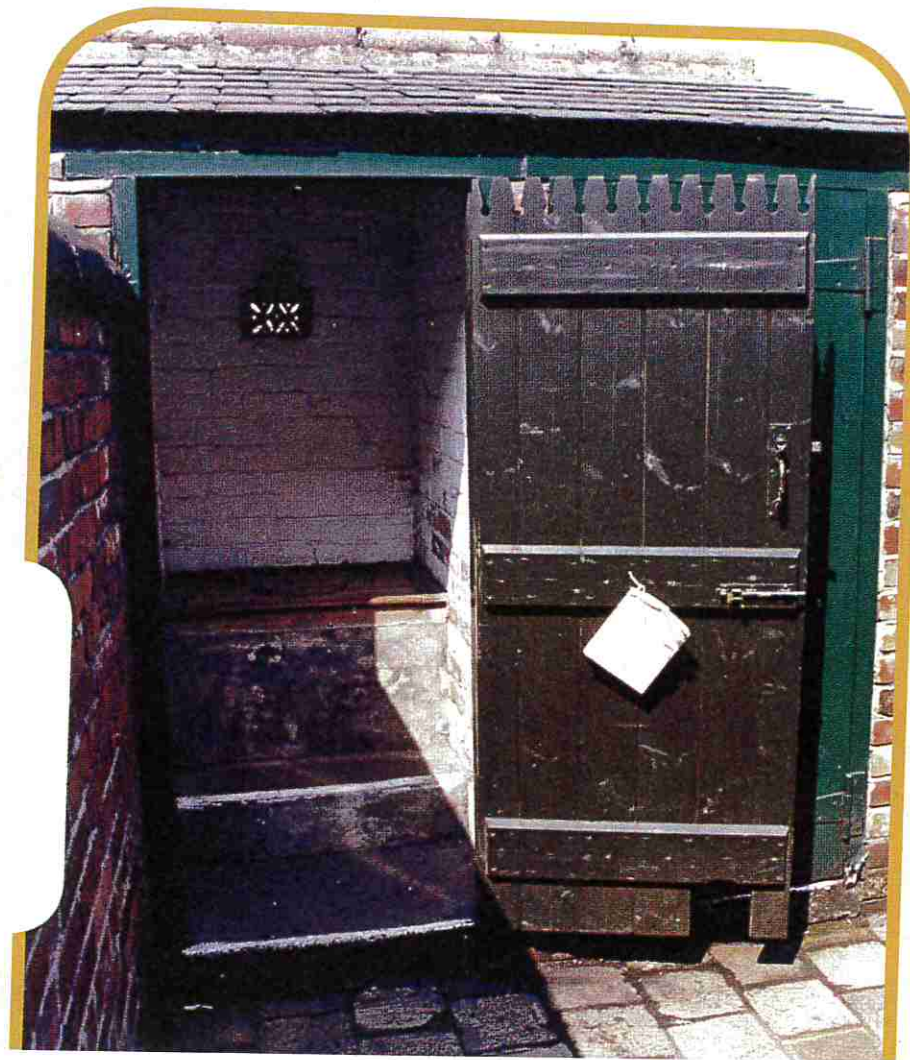


The bathroom

- Page 16: **PROVE IT** Does Jim like his house?

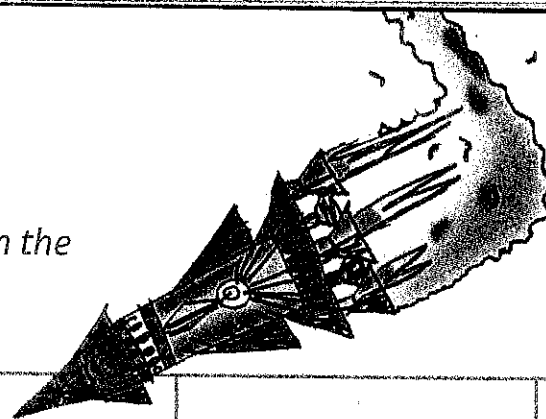
Questions to read and answer ★ ★
