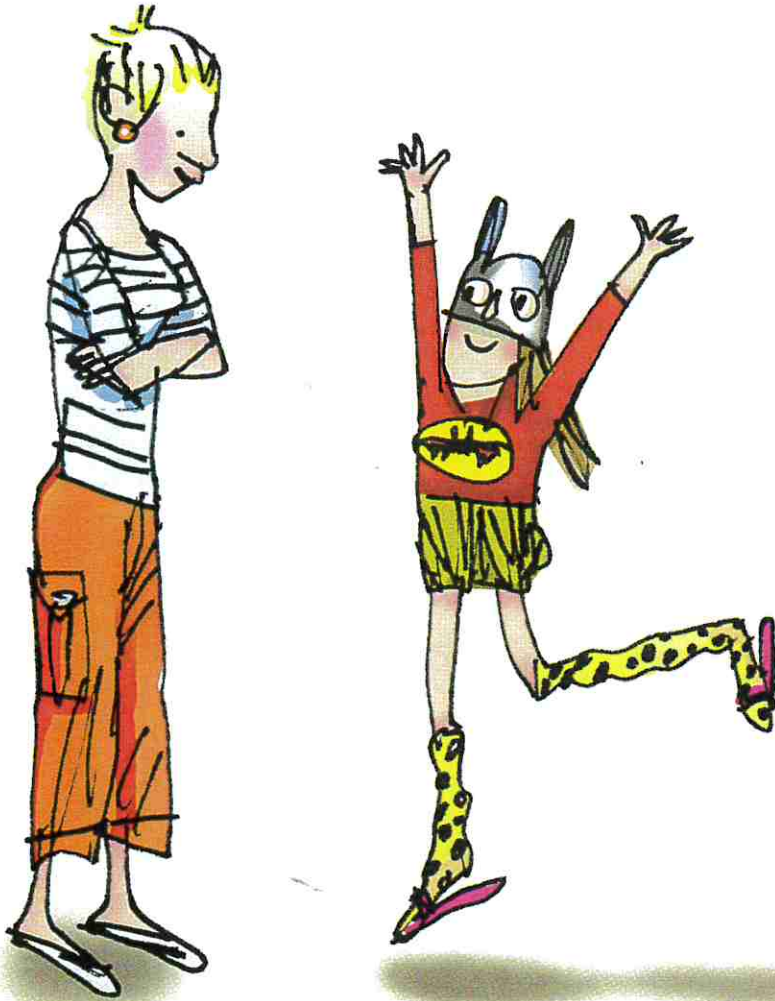


"Is that **you?**" **said** Miss Fox.
