Miss Wills and I often think of you and hope you are all well. We've been very lucky with the weather recently so we hope you've been able to get outside and enjoy the sunshine.

More learning has been uploaded onto the website and we just ask that you try your best – we don't expect everything to be done but there are lots of options for you and you can contact me if you need any help with anything.

This week in the **English** folder there are two spelling sheets for Year 4 and two for Year 5. Miss Wills has created some fantastic sheets for you based on the spelling lists for Years 3 and 4 and Years 5 and 6. Thank you Miss Wills! In the curriculum section on the website, under 'English', there are the spelling lists if you'd like to use them for handwriting practise or for daily dictation.

Also in the **English** folder are five activities, one for each day. I'm very excited to introduce you to Jane Considine's 'Sentence Stacking' sessions on her YouTube channel this week – the key worker children in school produced some great writing based on one of her videos when I was in last week. I can't wait to see what you produce!

There are also two reading comprehensions in the **English** folder for you based on extracts from two books. There are many other reading comprehensions on the website too if you'd like more practise. There is also a wordsearch in the folder with words from the KS2 'Non Negotiable Spellings' list.

In the **Year 4 Maths** folder there are activities for each day based on the White Rose Maths Home Learning videos. These can be found at <https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-4/> These videos are only 8 – 10 minutes long and should be watched before completing the work. There are activities linked to each video on the website that you can complete and I've added extra questions.

Year 5, your **maths** has been set by Mrs P and the instructions are in the folder again.

If you played the '**Factors and Multiples Game**' last week, I have also included some challenges involving the game that you may like to have a go at. They are in the **Year 4 Maths** folder but are for both Year 4 and Year 5.

For **science** this week I would like you to **create a poster** about the function of each part of the digestive system. Write a sentence about the role of each part (tongue, teeth, salivary glands, oesophagus, stomach, small intestine, large intestine, gallbladder, pancreas, rectum, anus) and you might like to draw each part too. Your poster should be informative and eye-catching! Perhaps a double page layout that we like in Class 4?

You can use the video clips on BBC Bitesize (KS2 -> Science -> Human body -> Digestive system) to help you collect information. There is also a quiz that you could complete in the Class 4 folder.

For **topic** this week I would like you to look at the 'feudal system' in Medieval times. The instructions are on the sheet but please email me if you need any help.
