Discuss the meaning (as used in the story) after the children have read each word.

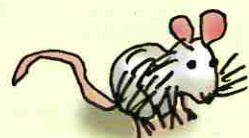
Introduction

Ouch!

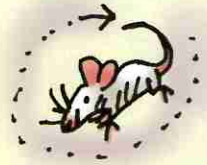
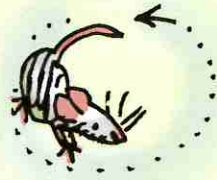
Look out! Look out!
