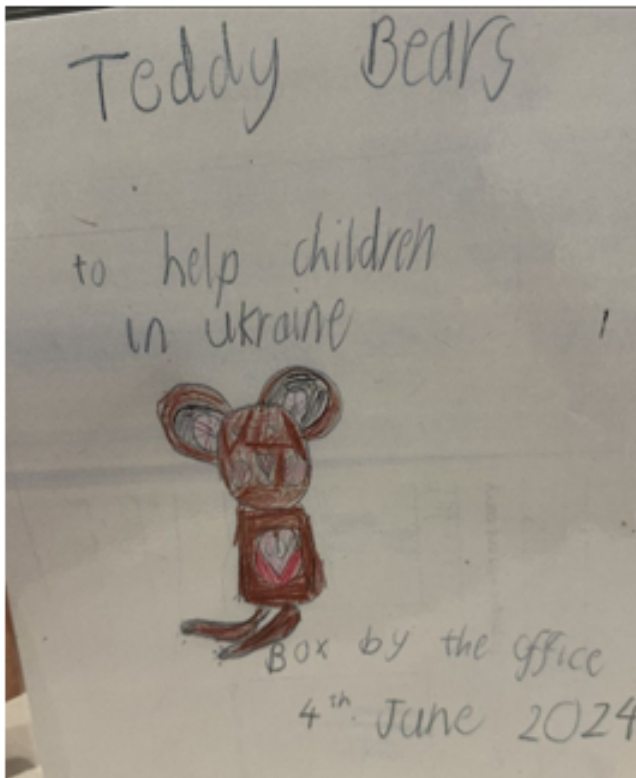
Tickets will be available from the school office from Monday 3rd June, priced £4 for the 2pm performance, and £5 for the 6pm performance.

Courageous Advocacy in Action



In their Religious Education (RE) curriculum, the KS1 children at **Kingsland CE Primary** have been immersed in lessons on empathy and compassion, with a particular focus on caring for others. Inspired by their learning, the children have embarked on a heart warming initiative to support [The Teddy Trust](#). The Teddy Trust, a charitable organisation, collecting teddy bears from children across the United Kingdom and dispatching them to youngsters enduring the harrowing effects of war, famine, or abuse.

Eager to make a difference, the KS1 pupils took it upon themselves to create posters, urging their peers and community members to contribute teddy bears to those in dire need, both domestically and internationally.

Their efforts have yielded remarkable results, with 30 children generously donating their beloved teddy bears to the cause. For many of these children, parting with their cherished companions was a bittersweet experience. However, they bravely embraced the notion of sacrifice, tenderly offering their teddy bears one final, affectionate embrace before relinquishing them to bring comfort and solace to children facing unimaginable challenges.

These four Y6 children represented the school fantastically at a 24 Maths Game competition held at Trinity Primary School on Friday. Well done!

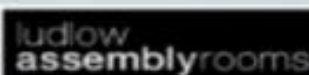

**‘Here for Herefordshire Holidays’
Exciting activities for Herefordshire children receiving benefits
related free school meals this summer!**

If you are a parent or carer of a school aged child 5 to 16 years old (Reception to year 11) who is eligible for **benefits-related free school meals**, You can book up to **20 sessions** of free activities. The programme is running from **Sat 20th July to Sunday 18th Aug 2024**.

This summer we have a huge range of activities to take part in; Drama workshops, Flip Out, trampoline, cheerleading, youth sessions, outdoor activities, farm visits, football, swimming, biking, circus skills, climbing, racket games, gym, aerial workshops, forest school, dance, boxing, craft and so much more. Your child/young person will also receive a free nutritious meal during each session. Some providers are able to offer provision for children with SEND or additional needs.

Places are limited and will be allocated on a ‘first come first served’ basis. We understand children aren’t always able to attend booked activities, however, We would kindly request that children are cancelled off the session via the booking system to enable others to attend.

The activities are only available to children who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals and checks will be made to ensure that children meet this criteria.



Educating for Hope and Aspiration



A prayer for PEACE

God of peace, we pray for peace in our world, and an end to conflict. Instead of hatred, let there be love. Shelter your children and protect us. Guide us and keep us from harm, so we can build a world of love and live our lives in peace. Amen.

Christian Value Family Reflection

Welcome to our Christian Value Family Reflection which offers some suggestions, thoughts and ways into exploring and reflecting on the value of this half term: **PEACE**

A reflection on PEACE by Hannah Vernon, Eardisland Church representative

Do you ever find yourself in a REALLY bad temper? Like you're boiling with rage? Or do you get really worried or scared about something, and you can't seem to think about anything else? I think this happens to everyone, a lot of the time! When I'm angry or anxious, all my thoughts and emotions spin wildly around me, and it's like I'm caught up in a whirlwind!

When this happens, I think about or look for the things which bring me PEACE. Cuddling my dog can provide some calm; counting to ten makes breathing a little easier; finding somewhere quiet to sit still helps; but what works best for me is a bike ride, and remembering my favourite line from the Bible: 'I will lift up my eyes to the hills' (Psalm 121). I hop on my bike, and pedal away until I can see Hay Bluff and other peaks of the Black Mountains in the distance. For me, that view and those words represent peace and they make me feel better: peace is a bit like **medicine for the soul**.

So, what does peace mean to YOU, and how do you find it? Maybe peace is a place, like your garden, or a den, where nobody else is allowed to enter! Perhaps peace is a feeling you get when someone gives you a long hug. Peace might be a moment, when nothing or nobody around you is disturbing you. You might see peace when you gaze at a burning candle or a calm sea. You might hear peace, when you're by a trickling stream or somewhere completely silent. Everyone's experience and definition of peace will be different, but, hopefully, everyone can find some form of peace in their daily life, wherever they are in the world.

For Christians, Jesus is the source of peace. In the Old Testament, Isaiah tells us of Jesus' birth and that he will be named 'Prince of Peace' (Isaiah 9:6). Then, when Jesus is a grown man, on the night before his crucifixion, he tells his anxious disciples, 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.' This is a promise that Jesus makes: that if **we have faith and put our problems in God's hands, He will put peace in our hearts.**
