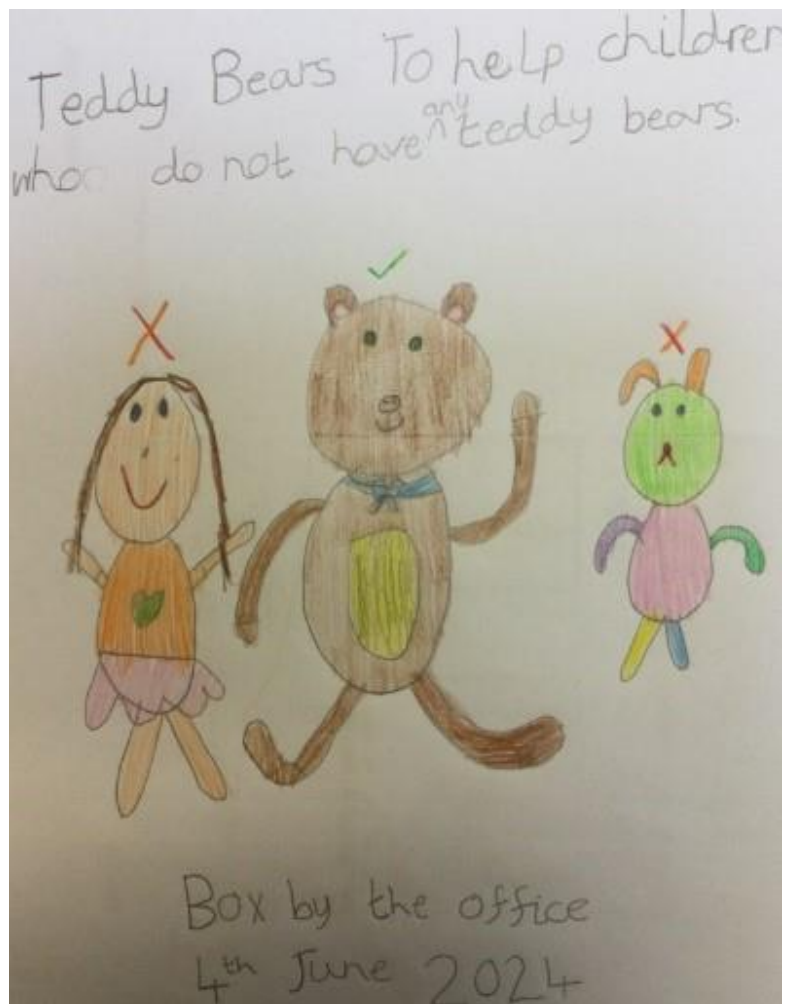
Class 2 are being Courgaeous Advocates ...

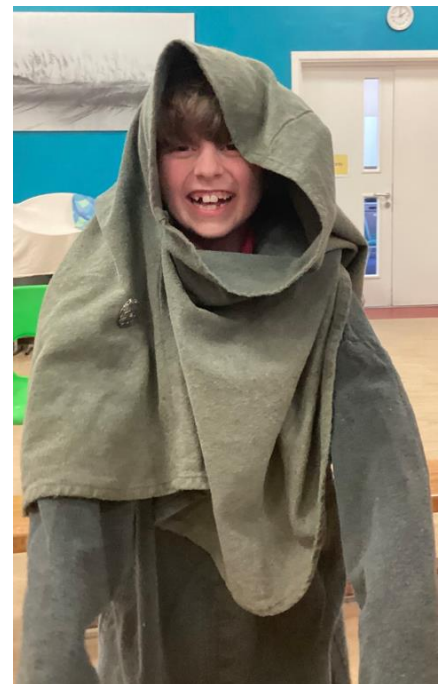
Please bring in any teddies (just bears - not other cuddly creatures please) and place them in the box in the entrance hall by 4th June.

In June, iSingPOP are coming to Kingsland CE Primary School where the children will be involved in a Christian singing and performing project.

iSingPOP helps children and families engage in Collective Worship in school, church and at home. They will be learning and performing a number of special songs with actions, which support the school values.

On 18th June, there will be two concerts in Kingsland St Michaels & All Angels Church, where we can join together as a community to celebrate the children's achievements. The first concert will begin at 2pm. The second concert will begin at 6pm; please ensure you arrive at the venue no later than 15 minutes before to ensure a prompt start. Each concert will last under an hour and we look forward to welcoming you. ALL CHILDREN WILL BE INVOLVED IN BOTH CONCERTS. Please put the date in your diaries!

Children are to wear **school uniform for the first concert** and **school skirts or trousers / shorts with an iSingPOP top or another brightly coloured T shirt for the evening concert (one plain colour – the brighter the better – no logos; no football tops).**

iSingPOP clothing and CDs can be purchased in advance of concert day by visiting www.isingpop.org/shop and following the instructions on screen. A CD or digital download is available to purchase on the website which includes the songs the children will be learning.

Please note, iSingPOP is a not-for-profit organisation and any income from sales goes back into the charity.

Our iSingPop instructor, Carys, will be coming into school on 10th, 11th and 12th June to rehearse the songs with the children. On 13th June, there will be a recording day, when professional sound engineers will record the children singing the songs in order to create a CD / song downloads, which will be available to purchase after the project completes.

The children are sure to have a brilliant time learning the songs and actions, and we hope to see you at the concerts on 18th June. Information about tickets will be distributed nearer the concert dates.

Thank you to Kingsland Church and the PTA for contributing to the cost of what will be a thrilling iSingPop project.

Y6 'Understanding Your Child' Workshop

Thank you to all the Y6 parents who have signed up to take part in our upcoming Y6 Understanding Your Child Workshop. If you have not yet signed up, we would strongly encourage all Y6 parents to attend. Please see the original letter below.

Dear Y6 Parents / Carers,

We are delighted to be able to offer a brand NEW opportunity for Y6 parents, as you consider your child's transition to high school. We know this can be a worrying time for some, as well as very exciting too.

On **Tuesday 4th June at 5.30pm – 7.30pm**, we are thrilled to welcome Lieke Blondeel to school to host a workshop purely for Y6 parents / carers. Lieke is the Solihull Approach Lead for Herefordshire Council – the workshop will focus on '**understanding your child**' to ease the transition into high school, with an aim of raising children's emotional wellbeing. There will be opportunity to ask questions and share ideas on topics such as 'Should I buy my child a mobile phone?' and 'How can I support my child with friendships in high school?'. It is anticipated that these sorts of questions will be being considered by many parents / carers, and this will provide a safe space to ask questions and think through what is best for each individual family circumstances. The workshop is for parents, and is not for children to attend.

Further, the workshop is described: 'During this workshop we look at brain development. Our brain continues to form new synapses and prune away unused connections throughout life so there is always potential for change. However, critical pathways developed during the first years of life can continue to exert a strong influence and may be hard to change. The brain goes through a further period of development in the teenage years providing a window of opportunity for change. We will look in detail at the changes of the brain of an adolescent and discuss why they may take risks, sleep a lot, be impulsive, emotional, rebellious, disorganised and distracted. Teenagers might physically look mature but their brains are still developing into their early twenties. This workshop can especially be used as part of the transition into secondary school.'

We would encourage ALL Y6 parents / carers to attend this fantastic new opportunity. Please complete this online form by Monday 3rd June to confirm your attendance:

For the school, this workshop will be the first of a number of other planned sessions based on the Solihull approach to '**understanding your child**', which will be rolled out to KS1 parents in the next academic year, and through staff training sessions throughout the autumn term, in order to generate a common and shared understanding across the school community. We are really excited about the intended and expected impact of these workshops, particularly in the post-Covid era.

In addition to the above workshop, there are **FREE ONLINE PROGRAMMES FOR PARENTS / CARERS**:

There are different programmes available for parents/carers, grandparents, friends and family covering from conception up to 19 years. Herefordshire Council has purchased a multi user license so all programmes are **FREE** for Herefordshire residents.

The engaging online courses help parents be the best mum, dad or carer that they can be, whatever the age of the child. They will find out more about their child's brain development and how their child's

feelings affect their behaviour. It helps with understanding why children behave a certain way when they are angry, have tantrums or trouble sleeping.

Available courses include:

- Understanding your child
- Understanding your child with additional needs
- Understanding your teenager's brain
- Understanding the impact of the pandemic on your teenager
- Understanding your brain (for teenagers only)
- Understanding your feelings (for teenagers only)
- Understanding your child's feelings
- Understanding your child's mental health and wellbeing
- Understanding the impact of the pandemic on your child



Christian Value Family Reflection

Welcome to our Christian Value Family Reflection which offers
some suggestions, thoughts and ways into exploring and
reflecting on the value of this half term: **FORGIVENESS**

A reflection on FORGIVENESS by Helen Webb, Chair of Governors

Forgiveness is one of the easiest and hardest of our Christian values. 'Sorry' can be easy to say but often we do not really mean it. Sometimes we cannot say it when we should because deep down inside, we are not sorry. By saying we are sorry we hope that we will be forgiven for something we have done wrong.

Someone bumps into you in the playground, 'sorry' they say and then run off. The next day the same person collides with you again and this time knocks you over, 'sorry' they say and run off again. Are they sorry? How many times should you forgive them? Can we forgive someone for hurting us when they are not really sorry?

We should all say sorry for things we have done wrong, or if we have hurt or upset someone. We all like to be forgiven.

I like cooking chocolate cakes. My children loved them. One day I baked a delicious chocolate cake but when I came to decorate it, all the flakes and the chocolate buttons in my pantry had disappeared. 'Why haven't you decorated the cake?' my family asked at teatime. I explained that the decorations had vanished. Silence from around the table; everyone looked guilty. Later, as I was washing up, my oldest daughter, Rachel, came into the kitchen; she was very sorry she had eaten the sweets with her friends when they had come around to play. 'That's OK, but next time ask first' I said and forgave her.

Easter usually means a lot of chocolate eggs! I had an 'Easter egg' cupboard where they were kept and eaten on the days following Easter. After the chocolate decorations' incident, Rachel's final Easter egg disappeared. She had saved it until last as it was an extra special one. Everyone else had finished theirs. She insisted someone had eaten her egg and was very cross. Eventually, after a heated family conference, her little sister, Ruth, admitted eating it and said sorry. Rachel was furious and refused to talk to her for a whole week. She would not forgive her little sister even though I had forgiven her for eating the decorations.

Sometimes it can be very hard to forgive, even someone you love. Ruth could not give the chocolate back to her sister because she had eaten it. Just saying sorry does not always make it right, but we still like to be forgiven.

There is a story in your Lion Storyteller Bible on pages 108 and 109 about forgiveness. Peter asks Jesus how many times you can forgive someone. Jesus tells a story about someone who is forgiven but cannot forgive when someone hurts them. When Jesus was dying on the cross, he cried out to God for forgiveness, not for himself, but for all of us, not just for those who had crucified him, but for all of us to be forgiven for our sins: 'Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing' (Luke Chapter 23, verse 34).

I have said 'sorry' to God many, many times. I hope he is not counting how many times I have asked for forgiveness!
