Dear NHS,

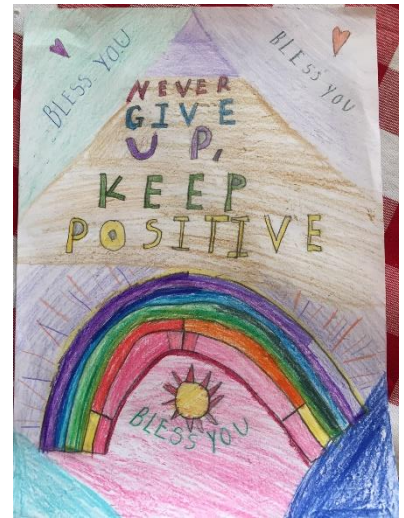
Our school has decided to thank you for being so strong and brave throughout this difficult time. It is probably stressful at the moment, but keep on persevering and things should go back to normal after a while.

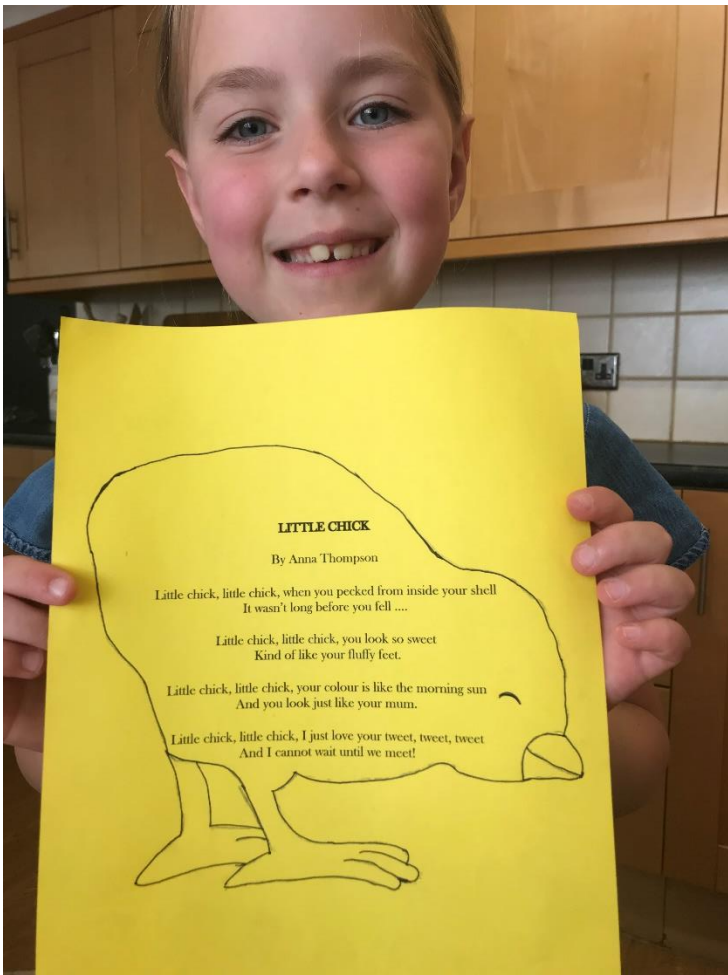
I am sure you are working hard throughout this tough time and we are all very grateful that you are trying to save people's lives: but also risking your life.

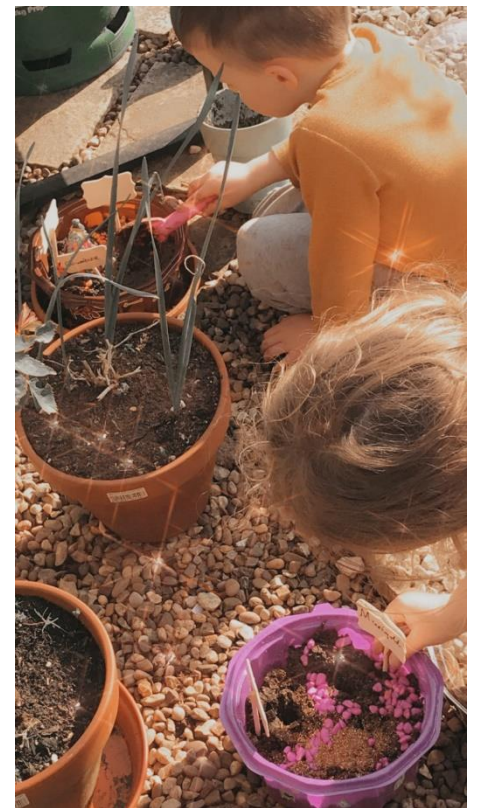
Dear NHS,

Once again I'd like to say how grateful I am. You are all Heroes and when this is over you deserve to spend time with family and friends, doing the things you love.

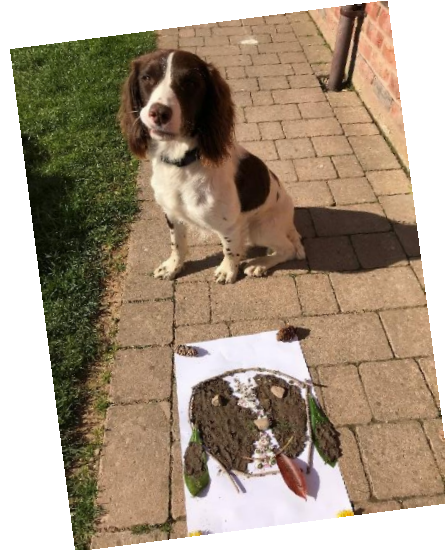

- Hope is for **E**veryone (rich or poor). We can all be enthusiastic about tomorrow

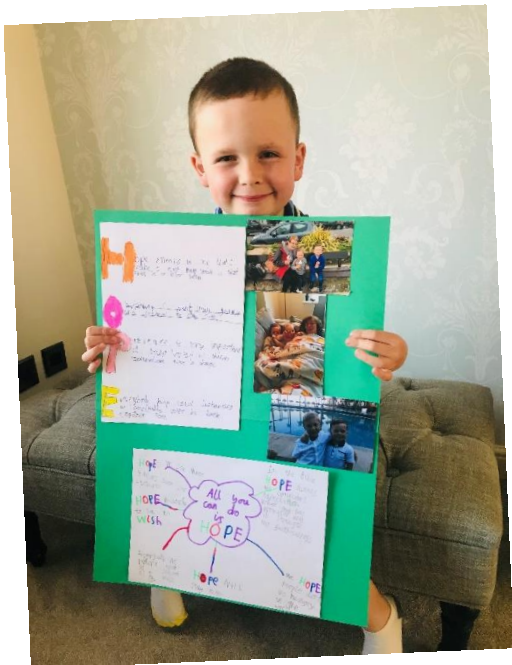
Why is HOPE important?

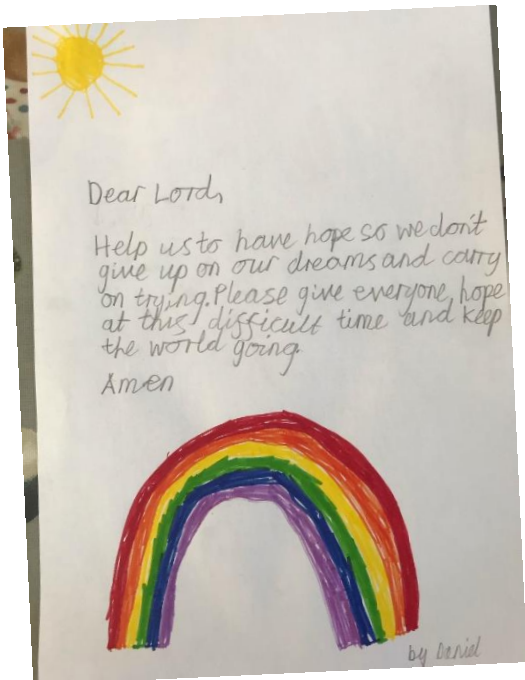
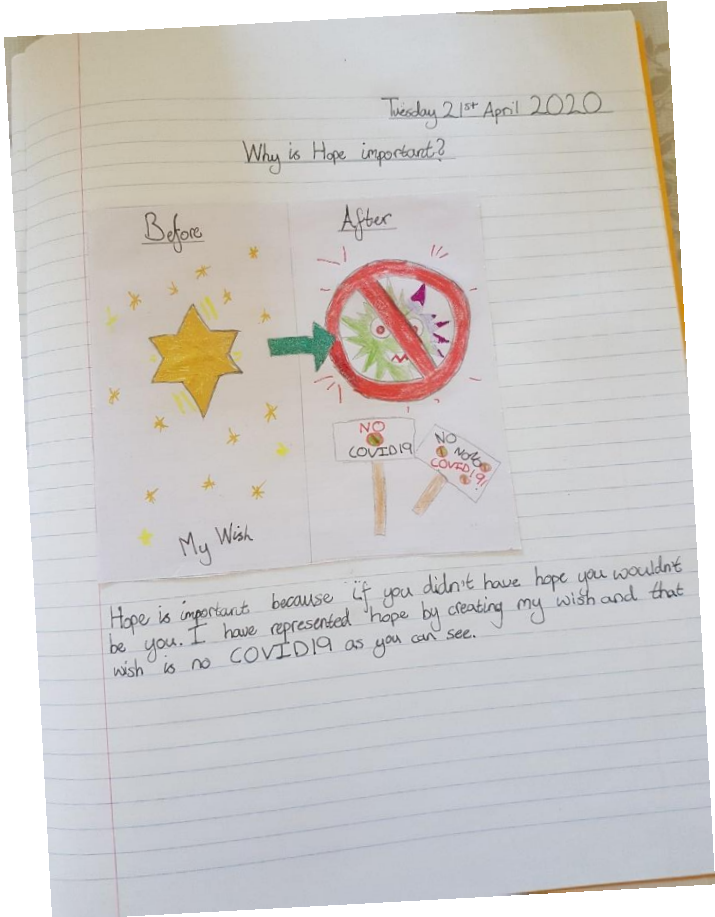
At this moment in time these are the things I hope for:

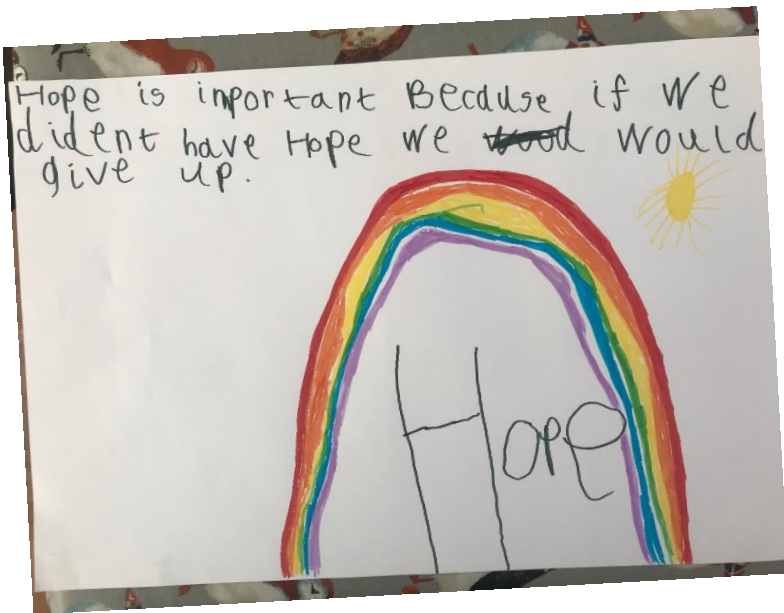
- Me and my family to stay safe during covid-19

- I hope McDonalds opens soon!



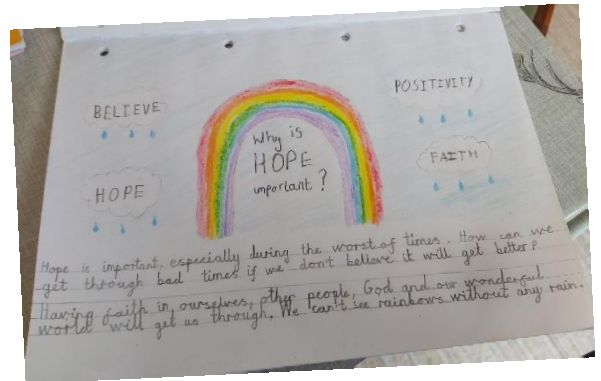

HOPE THROUGH THIS PANDEMIC

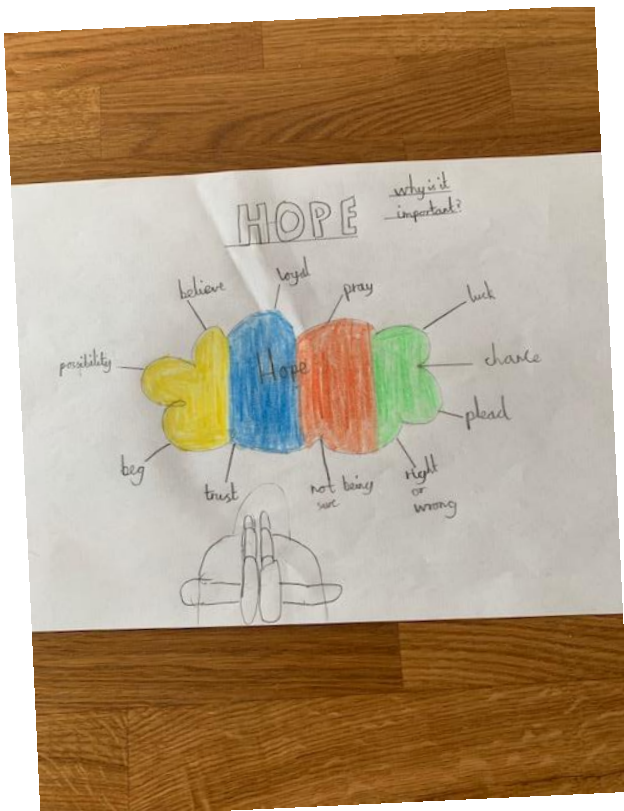

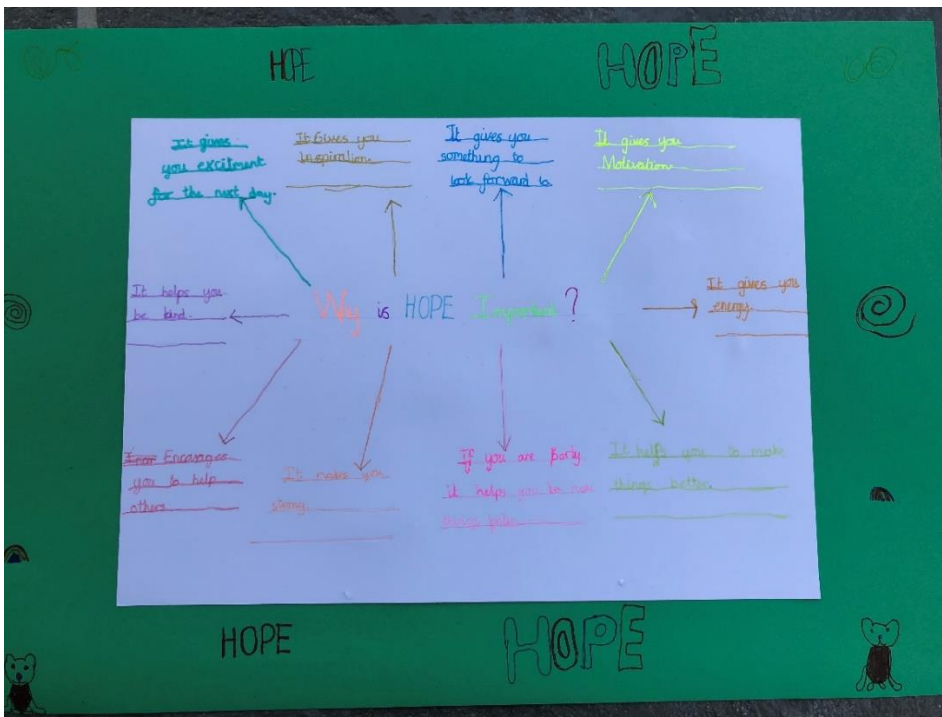
Hope may not seem big,
