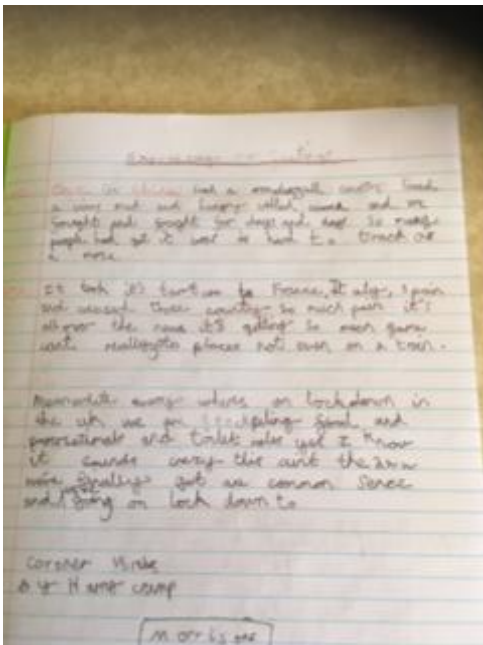
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Harry and Grace have been working hard on Day 1.

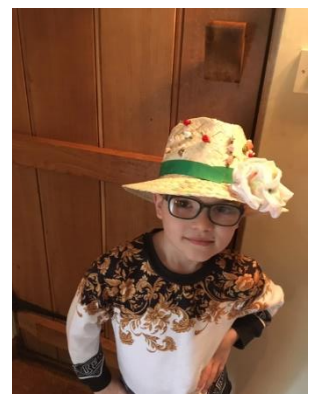


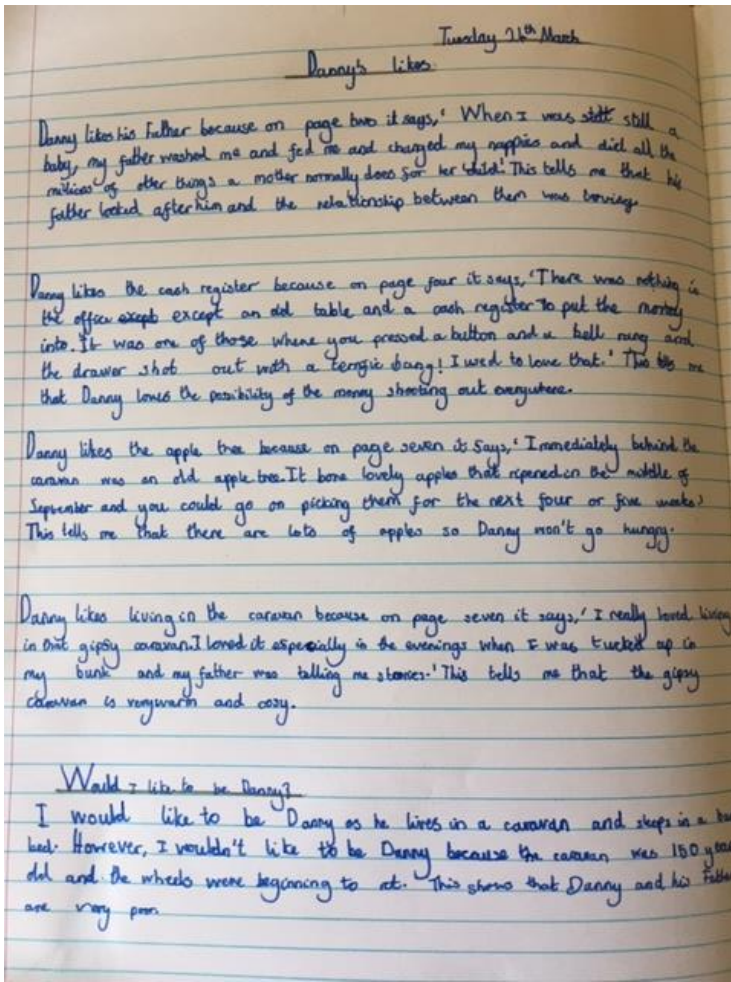


Millie has been making musical instruments and keeping fit.

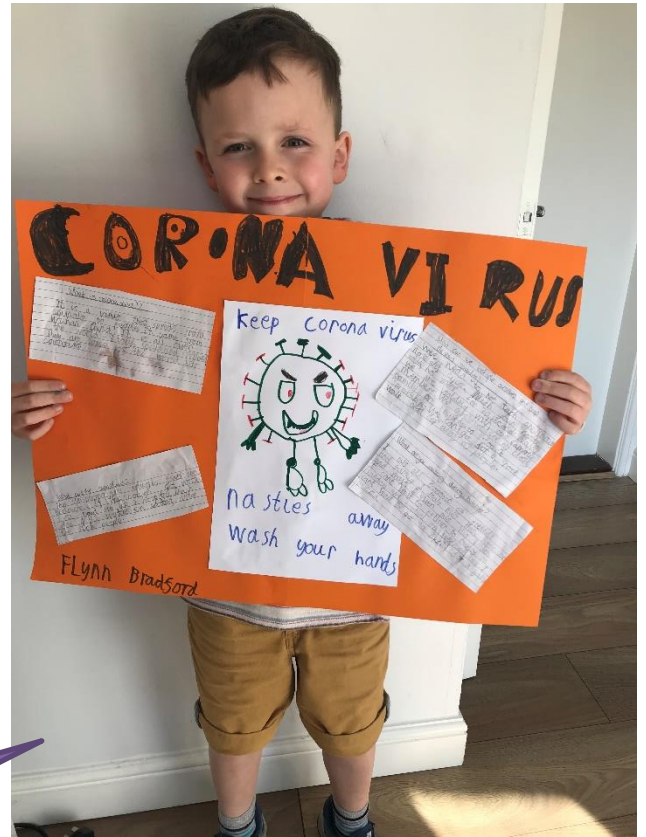


William has been making picnics, an Easter bonnet and an Easter garden.

Harriet has been keeping herself busy with a range of activities and Rosie has been doing some super writing.

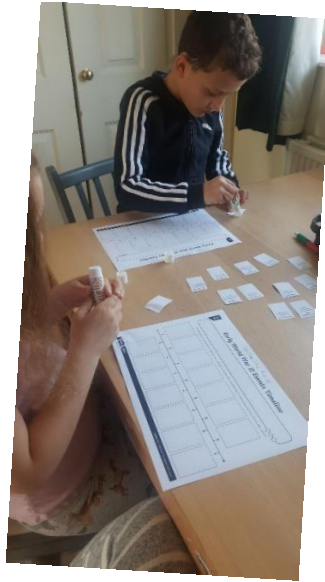

We are all hoping very hard that when the Coronavirus has blown over, you will realise what an amazing thing you have done. I hope you are all right; you must be so tired.

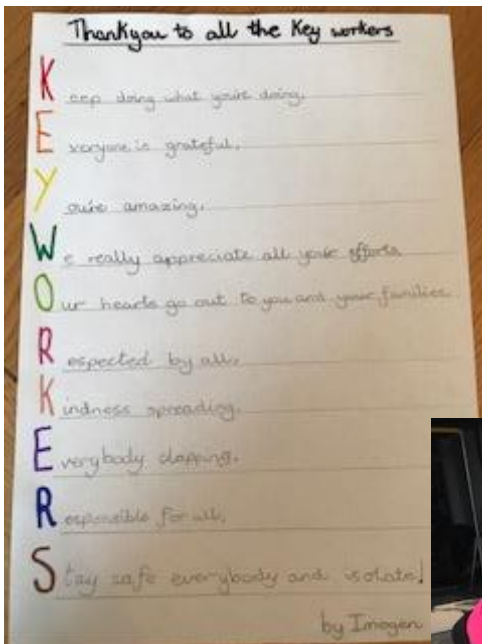
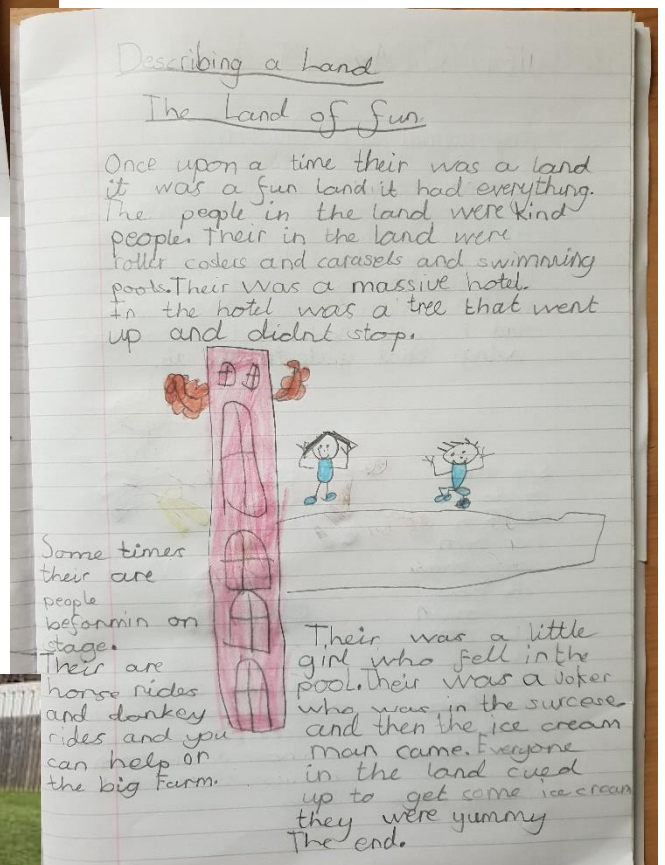

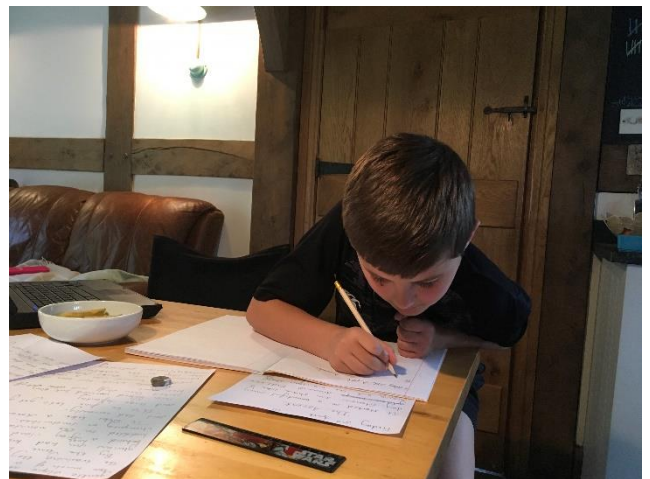
