## The Best School Trip Ever

# Stay and Play Club Booking Information



**Dear Parents / Carers,**

We are very pleased to be able to offer a new Stay and Play Club, providing after school child care provision. The club will start on **18<sup>th</sup> June**. It is essential that the club is self-sustaining, and will require a certain number of children to attend in order to make it viable. If the club is not financially viable, the provision will have to be reconsidered. The demand received from the consultation questionnaire sent out was high, so please do book in and use the provision.

## **Times and Fees**

There are three possible pick up / fee options:

- 3:15pm up until 4.45pm: £6.00
- 3:15pm up until 5:30pm: £9.00
- If a child attends an alternative after school club until 4.30pm and then wishes to join Stay and Play Club afterwards, a charge of £4.00 will be due between the hours of 4.30pm – 5.30pm.

## **Do they have to be regular bookings?**

Regular bookings in advance are advised to secure a place. However, we are happy to offer places on an ad-hoc basis as long as your child is registered with us and a space is available and payment is received.

Cancellations should be made 24hrs in advance.

## **How do I book a place for my child?**

Complete a Stay and Play Club Booking Form and return it to the school office as soon as possible with your payment. **Please TICK the days you wish to book and CIRCLE the pick-up time / fee option.**
