Well done to the children of Class 2 and their parents for making this possible.



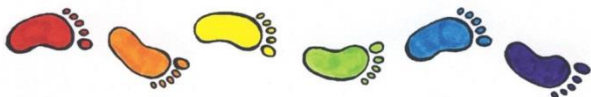
Sport News!
