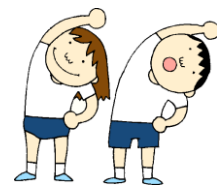

The Great Kingsland Cake Bake for London

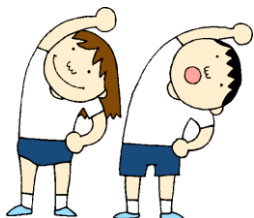
We are sure that you would like to join with us to support the community in London who have been affected by the fire tragedy at the Grenfell Tower.
