

Physical Development

- Pencil control and scissor skills
- Toilet and wash hands independently
- Show a preference for a dominant hand
- Develop spatial awareness
- Move effectively in a variety of ways, with balance and stability
- Use a variety of tools appropriately

Communication and Language

- Role play areas: starting to introduce a storyline/narrative into their play
- Children talk confidently about their News, ideas, thoughts and opinions; and listen attentively to those of others
- Demonstrate 'lovely listening' with increasing attention and recall
- Participate effectively in group discussions, stories and two-way conversations
- Ask appropriate questions and listen to responses
- Recall nursery rhymes and songs
- Demonstrate focusing attention and follow instructions effectively
- Build on vocabulary through experiences

- Subitising to 6 accurately

- Comparing amounts using correct mathematical language: 'more than', 'fewer than', 'equal to'
- Recognising 2D Shapes
- Identify 'bigger', 'smaller', 'longer', 'shorter', 'lighter', 'heavier', etc. and use this language accurately
