

Class One

Ideas and Activities to support learning at home.

1. Water Painting. You will need a bucket of water and a household paint brush. Practise letter and number formation on the patio, wall or driveway.
2. Go on a Shape Safari. Look for shapes in the world around you. How many triangles, rectangles, circles and squares can you see?
3. Make rhyming word-banks. Choose a rhyme and write it at the top of the page e.g. _an, _et, _ig, _ot, _in. Child uses sounds to create a list of rhyming words; man, can, tan, fan, ran.....
4. Make a treasure box to show and tell in school based on "My History". Decorate a shoe box and fill with memories e.g, first toy, first Babygro, photo, christening gift etc., (explanatory letter and label enclosed)
5. Pair all the socks in the wash basket
6. Write a letter to Granny and/or Grandad.
7. Make a cake and decorate it.
8. Play a board game
9. Go on a Spring Scavenger Hunt (enclosed)
10. Play Schools. Teach your teddies their sounds. (child writes each sound on a small square piece of paper/card)
11. Grow some cress. Take an egg shell, put some cotton-wool inside and dampen it, draw a face on the outside and see how quickly it's hair (cress) will grow.
12. Listen to a favourite story. Draw a story map of the story showing how the story began, the characters, events and ending. Now retell the story to a grown up.
13. Have a tea party for the teddies and dolls. Each has a plate and a cup – how many do you need?
14. Practise counting. How many.....teaspoons in the drawer, flowers in the vase, candles in the lounge, cushions on the settee, steps on the stairs apples in the fruit bowl etc. Give sticky notes or squares of paper for child to label with a number.
15. Ball skills; practise until you.....can throw and catch a ball 5 times, bounce and catch a ball 5 times – without dropping it.
16. Listen to an Easter story from your Storyteller Bible; **The Great Parade** pg132, **An Important Meal** pg 136, **A Dreadful Day** pg 138 and **A Happy Day** pg 140
17. Read and write 'Tricky Words' practise e.g. and, to, went, the (Words already given to families)
