

Dear Parents and Carers

The following are some subject areas your child could look at while at home. There are website links to follow with interactive activities and worksheets that could be printed out. It would be advantageous for your child to have a routine of doing some home learning every day. Wherever possible try to adapt online ideas into practical physical activities to avoid too much screen time. E.g: if it is a measuring activity you could do it practically in your home and garden.

Your child's home learning books (new and finished book) have been sent home with them to enable them to look back at spellings and times tables practice. An extra exercise book has also been sent home for them to use as a rough book. The rough book does not need to be returned to school. Home Learning Books are **only** to be used to revisit work and for the Mt Everest presentation. Please do not use them as rough books or practice books.
